### Description

Teotihuacan (Place of the Gods) was a major trading center with a network of trade routes that infiltrated and influenced Mesoamerica as far south as Escuintla and Rio Seco. The monkey-faced figure and double-chambered

whistling vessel is of a type common to Kaminaljuyu located in southern Guatemala near the border of Honduras.
